There are two options for placing pavement markings such as parking lines, handicap parking symbols, crosswalks, etc. In the past we have painted the markings on the blacktop. The lines are not straight, the paint bleeds into the blacktop, and repainting is necessary every year. The other option is thermo-plastic. The lines and markings are purchased as plastic sheets, and then heated so that they adhere to the blacktop. This results in

straight lines, a clearer image, and a longer lasting marking that doesn't need to be repainted every year.


Borough Council recently purchased the equipment necessary for the application of thermo-plastic, and crews will soon begin installing the new white lines and markings.

Prave Street will be the first place that we try the new thermo-plastic. 1,100 feet of white bicycle lane markings, several bicycle emblems and crosswalks will be installed. Following street resurfacing later this year, new parking spaces and crosswalks will be installed with

thermo-plastic on West Sample Street, West Crawford Street and East Lloyd Street.

swimming Pool Op

Ebensburg's new swimming pool opened on Memorial Day weekend to large crowds. Since then, with the exception of one relatively cold week, the pool has been well attended. The sale of annual and daily passes has tripled.

As a result of this project, the 70 year old swimming pool is now in total compliance with current Codes. All drains have been replaced, filtrations systems were modernized, handicap access was provided, and leaks were stopped. Water slides and play structures were installed. The new pool is heated. The concrete deck was replaced, and the interior of the pool was tiled instead of painted. The new pool even features deck chairs.

Patrons will not recognize the interior of the bathhouse. Privacy has been provided for all restroom and changing facilities, and it is no longer necessary to pass through the bathhouse facilities to enter and exit the pool.

swimming Pool Trail

Many Ebensburg residents remember walking a trail to get to the swimming pool. A church group of volunteers was in town during the week of July 16th and cleared and mulched the new trail It begins at the abandoned section of East High Street just below Tanner Street, crosses the abandoned railroad bed. and then follows the rail bed to the top of the hill above the pool. This is a safe shortcut for walkers to take to the pool in order to avoid busy Rowena Drive.

NEW PAVILION

Work is progressing on a new green space at the former Babcock Lumber Company site on South West Street near the Ghost Town Trail. A new pavilion has already been erected. Work on new curbing and sidewalks is beginning now. Once the curb is in place, the parking lot will be paved. After paving, a new security gate will be installed protecting the borough's storage buildings at the rear. New trees and landscaping will finish off this project. This project will improve aesthetics at that entrance to town, will provide those using the Ghost Town trail with a place to rest, and will allow spectators at Memorial Field a place to get out of the weather.

SIGNAGE

As use of the Ghost Town Trail continues to increase, Ebensburg wants to make its presence better known. When entering Ebensburg from the west on the Trail, there is not a sign that welcomes riders to Ebensburg or even lets them know that they are in Ebensburg. Borough staff is beginning to plan a 2013 project that will correct that problem, and encourage riders to ride up Cherry Street and visit Downtown Ebensburg. We also want to see riders proceed all the way through town to the end of the Trail at Rowena Drive, and introduce them to the swimming pool, Lake Rowena and many of Ebensburg's other recreation venues. New Gazebo

Work is wrapping up on the replacement of the Kimball Park gazebo in the center of town. The old wood gazebo was rotting and in poor condition. The new gazebo is a steel structure with a wood roof. When completed, four new benches will be installed under the gazebo.

Visioning— —Committee

Borough staff has been meeting with a group of volunteers from in and near Ebensburg forming ideas for new projects. The group has discussed downtown signage, uses for the former prison and middle school properties, downtown planters, outdoor dining, marketing ideas, parking and many other issues affecting the quality of life in Ebensburg. The group expects to hold its final meeting near the end of summer, and to present a prioritized list of future ideas.



The Ebensburg Municipal
Authority was awarded a
\$5,050,000 low-interest loan
for the planned water system
improvement project. Bids for
the project will soon be
considered and awarded in July.
The project is expected to be
completed by mid-2013.

This project involves the construction of new water lines in the area of Crestwood Estates, Mylo Park and the east end of the borough; a new treatment process at the plant; and a new residential metering system.



Sidewalk improvements in Ebensburg are continuing in 2012. New sidewalks in the 100 and 200 blocks of West Sample Street and West Crawford Street and the 200 block of North Cherry Street have already been completed. Work will continue this summer to add new curbing along East Alton Street and South Cherry Street, and to install a new sidewalk on the Lloyd Street side of the Courthouse. Those streets will be paved as soon as

the new curbing is completed.

Plans are also underway for sidewalk improvements along West High Street between Beech Street and Sheetz. That project will not occur until 2014, but meetings with affected property owners will begin later this year. We also intend to extend sidewalks further down Rowena Drive to Lake Rowena.



Prave Street Project

Some work has already begun on improvements to Prave Street between Center Street and the YPCC, and much more is expected soon. The edges of the parking area for the Ghost Town Trail have been straightened, and new sugar maple trees now line the street. Borough crews will soon begin installing 4'-wide bicycle lanes on both sides of the street, greatly improving safety for those using the Ghost Town Trail or just riding to the YPCC. Crosswalks will



be installed across Prave Street at Julian Street and Cherry Street. While the existing gravel parking lots will largely remain as is, improvements will be made at the entrances from Center Street and Julian Street with paving and landscaping. Finally, the brick pattern currently on Cherry Street will be extended further to meet Prave Street.


