IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS MAKE NOTICEABLE IMPACT ON COMMUNITY

2008 was a very busy year in Ebensburg Borough. will receive a new backhoe and tractor mower, Projects completed included the new Prave parking lot next to the courthouse; acquisition and development of Penn Eben Park; new sidewalks and curbs on North Marian Street and South Julian Street; the upgrade of the wastewater treatment plant; system. The water department will interconnect new restrooms, boat launch and paving at Lake Rowena; new stormwater lines and catch basins on Lovell Avenue; development of a regional comprehensive plan with Cambria Township and Jackson Township; installation of bike route signs through the borough; and approval of natural gas leases for borough-owned properties.

While other municipalities are struggling just to meet day-to-day expenses, Ebensburg Borough is continuing to move forward and make improvements. Borough officials believe that an ongoing capital improvement program is essential to Ebensburg's future, and that efforts must continue through these difficult economic times.

Improvements have been budgeted in the various departments of borough government in 2009. The police department will receive a new police cruiser, body armor, updated computer software and painting of the police office. The public works department

and will tackle street paving, sign replacement and repairs to the Tanner Street bridge. The wastewater department will begin efforts to eliminate infiltration from the sewage collection several dead end water lines and install new filter valves at the treatment plant. The recreation department will upgrade the bathhouse and install new playground equipment at the swimming pool. New bleachers and sidewalks will be installed at Memorial Field and the soccer field leveled and reseeded. New playground equipment will be installed at Lake Rowena.

While times are tough, Ebensburg Borough is able to continue to invest in its future by employing strict budgetary compliance and fiscal restraint.

SIDEWALKS TO BE COMPLETED THIS YEAR

Ebensburg's efforts to undertake new sidewalk improvements will continue in 2009. New sidewalks and curbs will be installed along both sides of the entire length of West Ogle Street, and the 700 & 800 blocks of West Triumph Street, between Memorial Field and High Street. The project will also include a new stormwater line and catch basins near the rear of the Falchini properties. The project is expected to begin as soon as weather allows and be completed by the end of summer. Once the project is completed, both streets will be resurfaced.

Three other sidewalk projects are still being considered by borough officials. First in line is East High Street between Caroline Street and Lake Rowena. The second priority is West High Street between Beech Street and Mylo Park. Both of those projects are on State highways and depend on receiving grant funds from the State. The third project is North Center Street and East Highland Avenue. This project depends on a consensus being reached among residents relative to trees and could be undertaken as early as 2010.

ROWENA DRIVE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT



PennDOT will soon replace the bridge on Rowena Drive that crosses the head waters at Lake Rowena. The entire bridge will be removed, and the new bridge constructed at the same site. PennDOT was not able to provide a temporary road around the project. Detour signs will direct traffic along Lakeview Road between Route #22 and Rowena Drive.

The project is scheduled to begin as soon as school is out for the summer, and completion is expected before the new school year begins.

KIMBALL PARK

The gazebo park in the center of Ebensburg has a new name! The park is now known as "Kimball Park" in honor of Mr. L. Robert Kimball. Mr. Kimball is of course the founder of L. Robert Kimball & Associates, a nationally recognized engineering firm headquartered here in Ebensburg Borough.

Mr. Kimball spearheaded the fundraising effort to construct the park in the 1990s. He has also been a generous benefactor to many of the community's improvement projects over the years. He and the firm have been directly involved in construction of the YPCC, the Ebensburg Tennis Center, Memorial Field, the Ebensburg Hockey Rink, and downtown streetscape project. He has been a devoted citizen of Ebensburg Borough all of his life, and is always very willing to assist in so many ways to make Ebensburg a great place to live.

One of the requests that residents made in a recent survey was for an additional day each month for recycling pick-up. Borough Council agreed that this was a good idea, and Ebensburg now collects recyclables twice each month. In addition, residents are now permitted to recycle newspapers.

Residents that wish to participate in the voluntary recycling program can pickup a blue recycling container, free of charge, at the municipal building. Recyclables are picked up at the curb on the 1st and 3rd normal garbage collection days of each month.

SWIMMING POOL UPGRADE

Ebensburg's swimming pool was originally constructed in 1938, making it one of the oldest pools in the state. Over the years it has received partial replacement of the gutters, filtration system and piping; but 70 years later it remains much the same as when originally built. It is long overdue for a major makeover.

Borough officials are excited about this project to overhaul one of the most used recreational facilities in the region, and judging from comments received, residents are very excited too.

The baby pool would be eliminated and instead incorporated into the main pool with play water structures. A shelter will be constructed where the baby pool currently sits. The entire pool would have "zero-depth" beach-type entry. A handicap ramp will be available into the deep end of the pool. The pool surface will be plaster and tiles, eliminating the need for \$10,000 paint jobs every year. Leaking joints would be repaired and drains made safe. The circulation & filtration systems will be brought up to current standards. Water slides and tubes will be added. The pool will be heated. New concrete decking will be installed, and 100 deck chairs will be available.

In addition to bringing the pool up to current codes and standards, the improvements are intended to increase use at the facility. The new pool will be popular with young and old alike.

This is an expensive project, estimated at \$1,000,000. Council expects to receive a grant for \$300,000 of that cost. The balance will have to be raised locally, similar to the local fundraising that made the YPCC a reality. A committee of volunteers has been formed to handle that monumental task of raising the necessary funds. If you would like to be a part of the committee, please contact the YPCC at 472-4277. This is an important project for the Ebensburg area, and everyone is encouraged to participate in efforts to make our swimming pool the facility that it should be.



24-Hour Access Now Available To Recreation Facilities

Patrons of the Ebensburg Tennis Center and YPCC are now enjoying a unique benefit; 24/7 unrestricted access to the facilities. Members are provided cards allowing them to access the buildings at any hour. Advance registration of tennis courts, fitness equipment and other amenities is now done on-line. Cameras monitor access to the properties and the lobbies. The new system, already well received by the members, cost the borough \$20,000 but will result in an annual savings of \$26,000 in labor costs.

Junior and Adult Tennis Lessons-The Ebensburg tennis center has a wide range of tennis lessons available for junior and adult tennis players. There are tennis clinics that cater to all playing levels. A tennis clinic is a group lesson. People who play at a specific playing level are grouped together to do drills to improve their tennis skills. Tennis clinics are offered at many different times through the week. There are also private lessons for one on one individual instruction. The average cost of a tennis clinic is \$9.00 an hour and \$45.00 for a private lesson per hour.

<u>Round Robins and Mixers</u>-There are many different round robins and social tennis gatherings at the tennis center. Many of these events are centered around a special time of the year. The round robins are a nice way to meet your fellow members and find people to play tennis with. There are round robins for all levels of play. All of the social tennis events are not just for adults. We offer many different social tennis events for juniors-pizza parties and BBQ's.

League Tennis- The tennis center offers different leagues for people who might not have the time to schedule matches to play. The tennis staff puts you in a league based on your playing ability. Each week you will have a different opponent to play. Tennis leagues run for 8 or 10 weeks. There are singles and doubles leagues. Tennis leagues are available for adults and juniors.

Art Show Receives Grant

DEP REQUIRES ELIMINATION OF INFLOW & INFILTRATION

We have been saying for some time that DEP is requiring the borough to eliminate sources of inflow and infiltration (I&I) from our sewage collection system. Well, that time has come, and our efforts will begin within just a few weeks.

Infiltration is caused by illegal sources of stormwater being discharged into the sanitary sewer system. These sources can be downspouts, driveway drains, footer drains, and leaking service laterals. Borough crews will begin smoke-testing sections of town. Smoke is pumped into the sanitary sewer system and then rises out of any illegal tap identifying the locations of any drains, downspouts and leaks. Property owners that have any such illegal sources of infiltration will be required to pay to have corrections made.

A new Ordinance requires each and every property that is sold in the future to undergo a simple test of the sewage connection prior to the close of the sale. This will in most cases involve a physical inspection or a dye test to verify that no illegal connections exist.





The \$4 million upgrade to the wastewater treatment plant was completed at the end of 2008. The plant's capacity was increased from 1.2 million gallons per day to 2.0 million g.p.d. The Ebensburg Municipal Authority was successful in acquiring \$2.4 million in grants and \$1.6 million in loans at 1% interest. In addition to the higher capacity, the plant now utilizes a ultra-violet disinfecting method rather than chlorine. Ebensburg once again has a state-of-the-art wastewater treatment facility. The DEP imposed restriction on new customers is now lifted, opening the door to future economic development in the Ebensburg region.
