SEWAGE BILLS TO DECREASE

Ebensburg sewage customers will see a significant drop in their overall bills later in 2010. That's when an old PENNVEST loan finally matures. The loan's maturity will allow the last rate increase adopted in 2005 to be rolled back completely. The bi-monthly base rate will drop from \$68.50 to \$54.50 and the usage rate will drop from \$6.07 to \$.46/1,000 gal. That's an 18% decrease in sewage rates!

Conversely, while wastewater expenses will decrease drastically, water system rates will slightly increase. Near the end of 2010, the loan payment on an old project loan will increase by \$24,000 annually. There will also be an increased

focus beginning in 2010 on small-scale water improvement projects. At the same time that the above significant reduction in wastewater rates is implemented, a small increase in water rates will take effect. The bi-monthly base rate would increase from \$33.50 to 35.60. The usage rate would increase from \$4.33 to \$.46/1,000 gal. The effect will be a 5% increase in water rates.

The total effect of the two rate adjustments is an overall 9% decrease in utility rates. For the minimum user, that saves \$11.90 each billing. For the average customer, the adjustment will save just over \$17 each billing. The drop in utility rates will occur in the fall of 2010.

MARKETING CAMPAIGN AIMS TO BRING PEOPLE TO TOWN



Since 1974, Ebensburg Borough has had only two mayors. Mike Tsikalas was elected in 1973, and served from January 1974 through 1993. Charlie Moyer ran for mayor in 1993, when Tsikalas did not seek re-election, and began in 1994. He served 16 years as mayor (and also 20 years on borough council).

"There is a certain amount of pride that a Mayor feels being the representative and voice of the community," said Moyer. "A mayor enjoys the privilege of serving the citizens, and knowing that when any of those citizens have a borough related problem he/she can be counted on for help. It is not a job that is easy to walk away from."


Randy Datsko is our new mayor. He is excited about the new role and hopes to continue the efforts of Tsikalas and Moyer.

Ebensburg Borough welcomes Randy as our new mayor and hopes that he will continue the tradition of serving the community for many years to come.



PROPERTY PURCHASE

In 2009, Borough Council agreed to purchase the former Babcock Lumber property on South West Street for \$95,000. The 1½ acre site contains two large storage buildings that the borough will use for storage of equipment that is not necessary to house at the main garage. Some of that equipment is seasonal such as snow plows, salt spreaders, a leaf vacuum and street sweeper. The site will also be used to stockpile materials such as topsoil, stone and gravel, pipe and road salt. A grant has been acquired to raze the front office building and kiln. That is expected to occur this summer. The borough will then improve the site to complement the Ghost Town Trail and Memorial Field.

2009 vs. 2010

2009 was a very busy year in Ebensburg Borough. Borough Council replaced several pieces of equipment and vehicles during the past year. Those purchases include a new 4-wheel drive police vehicle, a new tractor mower, two new pickup trucks, and replacement of a backhoe and front-end loader. Projects completed include the West Ogle Street sidewalks with improved stormwater system, improved drainage and new bleachers at Memorial Field, interconnection of water systems with Croyle Township, and several improvements to the water treatment and distribution systems.

While other municipalities are struggling just to meet day-to-day expenses, Ebensburg Borough is continuing to move forward and make improvements. Borough officials believe that an ongoing capital improvement program is essential to Ebensburg's future, and that efforts must continue through these difficult economic times.

Improvements have been budgeted in the various departments of borough government in 2010. One additional full-time officer has been added in the police department. The public works department will undertake a street paving project, replace the street name signs with larger lettering, and make repairs to the Tanner Street bridge. The water department will interconnect several dead end water lines and install new filters and valves at the treatment plant. One of the water department's trucks will be replaced. The recreation department will upgrade the pool bathhouse and install new playground equipment at Lake Rowena. The wastewater department will continue efforts to eliminate infiltration from the sewage collection system.

While times are tough, Ebensburg Borough is able to continue to invest in its future by employing strict budgetary compliance and fiscal restraint.



CONCERTS IN THE PARK WILL CONTINUE

A series of free concerts in Penn Eben Park highlighted the summer of 2009. The concerts were suggested by residents in the last resident survey, and Borough Council listened.

Sponsored by the Ebensburg Area Business Commission and Main Street Partnership, the concerts will once again run every Friday evening in August in Penn Eben Park.

"New this year, the concerts will be an hour longer," said Christine Strugala, Community Development Director. "Because they were so successful, performers will now play from 6pm until 9pm."

UPCOMING SIDEWALK PROJECT

Ebensburg's efforts to undertake new sidewalk improvements will continue in 2010. New sidewalks and curbs will be installed along both sides of North Center Street between the downtown and the middle school, and along most of East Highland Avenue. The project will also include the extension of Victorian streetlights along North Center Street, and repairs to catch basins at Horner Street. The project is expected to begin as soon as weather allows and be completed by the end of summer.

Plans have also been completed for a sidewalk project along East High Street and Rowena Drive, between the downtown and Lake Rowena. That project qualifies for special grant funding, and Borough Council hopes to see that project move forward as well in 2010 or 2011.

Ebensburg Borough Swimming Pool



By now everyone should be aware of Borough Council's plans to improve Ebensburg's swimming pool. Ebensburg's swimming pool was originally constructed in 1938, making it one of the oldest pools in the state. Over the years it has received partial replacement of the gutters, filtration system and piping; but 70 years later it remains much the same as when originally built. It is long overdue for a major makeover.

This is an expensive project, estimated at \$1,000,000. Council expects to receive a grant for \$300,000 of that cost, and the project cannot begin until a grant is actually secured. The grant was not approved in the 2009 round of grants, and we hope to receive approval later in 2010.

Borough officials are excited about this project to overhaul one of the most used recreational facilities in the region, and judging from comments received, residents are very excited too. In addition to bringing the pool up to current codes and standards, the improvements are intended to increase use at the facility. The new pool will be popular with young and old alike.

A committee of volunteers has been formed to raise the necessary matching funds. This is an important project for the Ebensburg area, and everyone is encouraged to participate in efforts to make our swimming pool the facility that it should be.



NEW AGENCY TO HANDLE BOROUGH CODES ENFORCEMENT

Borough council has approved a 1-year agreement with Middle Department Inspection Agency of Wexford, PA to provide building codes enforcement within the borough.

It was the intent of the Central Cambria Coalition to form a single codes enforcement agency, however, there is a shortage of qualified and certified individuals to fill the position at this time.

Although members will continue to search for the right person for the job, MDIA will be used for at least 2010.

All permits can still be obtained at www.ebensburgpa.com or at the borough office. Although, checks will need to be made out to MDIA.

Under the new arrangement, the Borough Manager will be responsible for all zoning and property maintenance enforcement. If a local enforcement officer is eventually hired, he/she will then assume that responsibility as planned.

It is important to note that MDIA will have constant contact with the borough and will stop in every other day to pick up and process applications. The building permit fees with MDIA are generally 15-20% lower than those previously charged.

Residents are reminded that Ebensburg Borough is continuing a DEP-required testing of residential and commercial sewage systems. The tests are intended to detect any connections that are allowing infiltration into the sewage system.

Infiltration is caused by sources of stormwater being illegally discharged into the sanitary sewer system. These sources can be downspouts, driveway drains, footer drains, and leaking service laterals. Borough crews will be smoke-testing sections of town. Smoke is pumped into the sanitary sewer system under pressure and then rises out of any illegal tap identifying the locations of any drains, downspouts and leaks. Property owners that have any such illegal sources of infiltration will be required to pay to have corrections made.

The smoke may on occasion enter buildings. That could happen if your sewage traps are empty or lacking. The smoke is non-toxic and leaves no residue. We will try our best to notify property owners in advance of any testing in your area. You will want to watch the local newspaper for any notices. The testing will occur in a specific section of town each year over the next five years.

Stoltz Hired as Full-Time Police Officer

Scott Stoltz is the newest full-time police officer with the Ebensburg Borough Police Department.

Officer Stoltz has been a part-time police officer for Ebensburg Borough since 2005, and was the Chief of Police of South Fork Borough.

Officer Stoltz holds an Associate Degree in Psychology, and is currently enrolled in a Bachelor of Science program for Criminal Justice Administration. He is a graduate of the Greater Johnstown Police Academy and is Act #120 certified.

"Scott has worked for the Borough of Ebensburg since April 2005 as a part-time officer," said Police Chief Terry Wyland. "Scott has been an exceptional officer and is an asset to the police department. He has experience in all areas of law enforcement. I welcome him as a full-time officer and look forward to working with him on a full-time basis."
