Ebensburg Wastewater Project

Excavation for the major sewage project began in June. Work was started along Lakeview Road at the south end of town, and will proceed through town in a northerly direction, taking a full year to complete. The contractor expects to complete areas south of High Street before the end of 2018. Work in the northern portion of town will continue through the winter.

As new sewage mains are installed, new taps will be provided for current customers. Current customers will not be required to pay new tapping fees. All customers will be required to have their sewer lateral (the private line between the house and the main) pressure tested. In most areas, we will not require any form of under-slab testing, but we will verify that all piping outside of the building's foundation is water-tight. We will also verify that all downspouts, driveway drains, footer drains, etc. are not connected to the sanitary sewer system.

Due to the age of the system, it is expected that most private sewer laterals will fail a pressure test and will require replacement up to the foundation. Property owners should begin planning for such an expense now. As main line construction is completed in areas, property owners will be notified when to initiate the repair or replacement and testing of their own sewer lateral, and will be provided with sufficient time to do so.

It is difficult to predict when the contractor will be working in any given area of town, or on a particular street. An anticipated work schedule is available every week on the borough's website (<u>www.ebensburgpa.com</u>) or Facebook page.

Sewer Line Testing

The initial notices requiring the testing/replacement of sewer laterals outside of the project area were mailed in March 2017 to customers in the Elderwood and Industrial Park sections of our service area. Those customers had until September 1st to bring their sewer laterals into compliance. All but three of those customers have completed the required work, and enforcement action has begun for those three.

In August 2017, a second batch of notices was mailed to the remaining customers in non-project areas including those north of Highland Avenue, along Manor Drive, Crestwood Estates, New Germany Road, Route 22 and Lovell Park sections. All customers in those areas were given until July 31, 2018 to gain compliance.

The sewer lateral line from the foundation wall to the property line shall be made to conform to current regulations including a cleanout near the foundation wall and a viewport at the property line. If a viewport already exists on the property, but is not visible or easily accessible, the owner must expose the viewport. If the existing sewer lateral fails the required pressure test, then the entire sewer lateral must be replaced or otherwise made to satisfy the air testing requirement. All required testing and work performed shall be inspected by the Borough while exposed.

The air pressure testing requirement applies to all components of the sewer lateral from the foundation wall to the connection stub. All components of the sewer lateral must be air tested by pressurizing with air to a minimum of five p.s.i. and thereafter held for a period of fifteen (15) minutes with no noticeable loss of pressure.

Customers who, for any reason, do not bring their private sewer lateral into compliance before the deadline will incur a 35% surcharge on their sewer bill.

Ebensburg does not require pressure testing under the basement slab, except in those rare cases where visual examination indicates the presence of stormwater. Complete information regarding sewer testing is available on the borough's website <u>www.ebensburgpa.com</u>. A sewer test application is also available on the website.

FIREWORKS LAW

What are the restrictions on where fireworks can be used?

- They cannot be ignited or discharged on a public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- They cannot be discharged from or within a motor vehicle or building.
- They cannot be discharged toward a motor vehicle or building.
- They cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure.
- They cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or another drug.

Firework Law Act 43 of 2017 Penalty

The following penalty shall apply:

• A person using consumer fireworks in violation of the provisions of this article commits a summary offense and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a **fine of not more than \$100.00**.



These are DANGEROUS EXPLOSIVE DEVICES that are ILLEGAL in all 50 States. Use or possesion of these dangerous devices should be immediately reported to your local police or fire department.



YARD WASTE DISPOSAL SITE

The Borough of Ebensburg has relocated its yard waste compost site from the rear of the YPCC to the Babcock property on South West Street.

The YPCC site was being abused by persons from outside of the borough and by commercial haulers. Borough Council wanted to continue the program, so it was necessary to move the collection bin to a more secure location.

The bin is now inside of a secure gated fence, and is monitored by security cameras. Borough residents



who wish to utilize the yard waste site can stop at the borough office to obtain their own key fob. The key fob costs five dollars, grants access to the site between dawn and dusk, and is good for a two year period.

2019 Sidewalk Project

The major sewage project is scheduled for completion in June 2019. It will be necessary to resurface many of the streets in the borough at that time, and Borough Council has planned ahead for that expensive project. Council has not resurfaced any streets for the past four years, knowing that many would be excavated during the sewage project. Those funds have, however, been saved for future street resurfacing, and by 2019 Council will have approximately \$650,000 available on hand for street paving.

Prior to resurfacing the streets, Council feels it is important to first undertake any curb and sidewalk repairs that are necessary on the affected streets. A very large sidewalk and curb project will be undertaken on Horner Street, Crawford Street, Sample Street, Caroline Street, South Marian Street and West Triumph Street. Information about the upcoming sidewalk project has already been mailed to all affected properties.

Design for that sidewalk project is already underway, and is expected to go to bid in early 2019.

YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS IN THE CROSSWALK — IT'S THE LAW!

Section 3542 of the Motor Vehicle Code requires all drivers to yield to pedestrians at nonsignalized intersections. Failure to yield carries a fine of \$50 and 2 points.

Proper Removal of Grease

The Ebensburg Municipal Authority has been dealing with an unusual amount of grease in the sewage collection system, and is warning sanitary sewer customers in Ebensburg Borough and Cambria Township about dumping any form of grease in any amount down the drain.

The existence of grease inhibits the operation of the treatment plant, and can cause blockages in the collection system. Any grease that arrives at the sewage treatment plant must be removed by hand, or requires special handling.

It is possible for borough staff to trace the origins of the grease back to a particular customer, but that is a time-consuming process. Instead, borough officials are warning all customers that the discharge of grease, in any amount, is punishable by a \$600 per day fine.



Summer Clinics at the Ebensburg Tennis Center

Interested in taking up the sport of a lifetime? If so, you should visit the Ebensburg Tennis Center. There are clinics and individual lessons for students of all ages and ability levels. Here is a detailed list of clinic times for juniors and adults:

<u>Pee-Wee Beginner Clinic</u> - This clinic is for children ages 5 thru 8 that have little tennis experience. Children will focus on scoring, court layouts and etiquette. Participants will learn tennis through a variety of drills games and mini competitions. Appropriate size tennis balls and racquets will be used for first time players. The clinic will take place on Wednesdays from 12-1 pm, Saturdays from 9 am to 10 am starting June 2nd and ending August 25th. * There will not be clinic held on June 6th.*

<u>Junior Beginner Clinic</u> - This program is designed for children who are new to the sport, ranging in age from 7 to 12 years old, some tennis playing experience is helpful. This clinic will take place on **Wednesdays from 10 to 11 am** starting the week of June 13th and ending August 22nd.

<u>Advanced Junior Clinic</u>-This clinic is for students who play at an advanced level and are interested in playing U.S.T.A. tournaments. The clinic will meet Wednesday mornings from 11 am to 1 pm stating June 13th and ending the week of August 22nd.

<u>Teenager Training Workshop</u> - This program is designed for students who currently have some tennis playing experience and are trying to take their game to a more advanced level. This program is ideal for boys and girls looking to play high school tennis at an elite level. This clinic will take place **Mondays 11 am to 12:30 pm and Fridays 11 am to 12:30 pm starting the week of June 10th and ending August 26th.**

<u>Adult Intermediate/Advanced Clinic</u> - This clinic places emphasis on establishing the correct technique on all of the shots: forehand, backhand, volley, etc. In these clinics there will be a focus on match play situations. This clinic will take place on Mondays - 11 to 12:30 pm, Wednesdays - 5 to 6:30 pm, Saturdays - 10 to 11:30 am and Sundays - 4 to 5:30 pm starting the week of June 4th and ending August 26th.

<u>Adult Beginner Clinic</u> - This clinic is for tennis players ages 18+ who have a minimum of 6 months playing experience. The clinics will focus on the basics: forehand, backhand, serve, etc. This clinic will take place on **Tuesdays from 5:00 to 6:00 pm and Sunday's from 4 to 5:30 pm starting the week of June 3rd and ending August 26th.**
