## Ebensburg's Historic District Listing

Ebensburg Borough staff and officials received notification in September that their nomination for listing on the National Register of Historic Places had been approved by the National Park Service.

The National Register of Historic Places is the nation's official list of properties that are recognized for their significance in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering and/or culture.

Ebensburg's period of significance spans 162 years, ranging from 1799 to 1961. Its areas of significance fall into commerce and architecture. There are three distinct eras in Ebensburg's history:

- 1799-1850 saw Ebensburg's early settlement and its importance as turnpike route, securing its position as a center of commerce and service for travelers along this major east-west route;
- 1850-1915 brought the completion of the railroad, railroad era tourism and the rise and impact of the automobile;
- 1915-1961 started with the devastating fire of 1915 and then the rebuild as an automobile oriented commerce, which changed travel and spending habits until the opening of the US 22 downtown bypass in 1961

The district is bounded roughly by Highland Avenue, West Street, Sugar Street and Triumph Street. It includes 422 contributing buildings and sites and 161 noncontributing. Buildings that contribute to the historic district retain integrity; their form and/or architectural details reflect their construction during the 1799-1961 period of significance. Buildings whose materials have changed, but without altering the overall design, still contribute to the historic district. The noncontributing properties were either constructed after 1961, or have been altered to an extent that they no longer reflect their historic appearance.

Under Federal Law, the listing of a property in the National Register places no restrictions on what an owner may do with their property up to and including destruction, unless the property is involved in a project that receives Federal assistance, usually funding or licensing/permitting.

### Council Adopts 2020 Budget

Borough Council has adopted a \$5,892,610 budget for 2020. The budget avoids a tax increase for the 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. There are several projects planned in 2020 including:

- 1) Recoating of downtown signposts, trash receptacles and benches as needed
- 2) Police will convert from paper citations to electronic.
- 3) Replacement of a pickup truck and dump truck.
- 4) Security systems at the water treatment plant will be upgraded.
- 5) Water line replacements on Arbor Street and North Spruce Street.
- 6) Equipment upgrades at the water treatment plant.
- 7) Upgrades at the swimming pool including new deck chairs, tile repairs and new chlorine feeder.
- 8) Repairs at Lake Rowena including a French drain, pier repairs and new concession stand.

11. Completed conversion to LED of all streetlights and parks.
12. Replaced a Ventrac mower.
13. Obtained a grant to raze a blighted house on East Ogle Street.

Effective February 1<sup>st</sup>, operation of the water treatment plant will be contracted to Inframark, a company that specializes in the operation of local water and sewer utilities. Inframark has been operating the Borough's sewage treatment plant since 2003.

The regulations applicable to water treatment are ever changing, and the availability of certified operators is very limited. Inframark provides the level of expertise necessary to assure that the quality of water on Ebensburg's system is of the highest quality.

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**The YPCC** – The primary mission of the Young Peoples Community Center (YPCC) has always been to provide activities and a safe, inviting place for the areas youth to play and hangout with their friends. While still keeping this at the core of the mission, the YPCC has evolved into a Health & Wellness Center as mentioned above. Adding various exercise classes into the daily activities at the YPCC. There is open gym daily (hours vary) at no cost for kids under 18 to play in the gym.

**Bike Rental Program:** In a partnership with Ebensburg Bicycle Shop owner, Tim Illig, and Cambria County Conservation & Recreation Authority, the YPCC started a bike rental program in 2018. Rentals can be hourly (\$8/adult or \$6/youth) or full day (\$32/adult or \$24/youth). Rentals include a helmet and anyone under the age of 12 is required by PA law to wear a helmet. **Pavilion Rentals** – The Borough rents out three pavilions at Lake Rowena and two at the Ebensburg Borough Swimming Pool. The cost to rent a pavilion is \$50.00. Call the YPCC to check availability and to make a reservation.

**Outdoor Skate/Hockey Rink** – Located at Lake Rowena, the rink is open year round for street or in-line hockey. There are hockey goals provided and lights for evening play too. Best part is, it's FREE and open to the public.

**Swimming Pools** – Since it's renovation in 2011, the Boro Swimming Pool has been enjoyed by many. The area is fortunate to have a public pool that is up-to-date, heated, kid friendly and handicap accessible. The Borough Pool is available for after hour private party rentals. In addition to the outdoor Borough Pool, the YPCC is also managing swimming lessons and open swims at the Central Cambria High School Pool.

## STREET RESURFACING

After having excavated in the south side of town for the sewer, gas, stormwater and sidewalk projects, all streets south of High Street have been milled and repaved, leaving no sign of all the work that occurred. The same will happen in other areas of town as the various projects are completed.

In 2020, as soon as the gas and sidewalk projects are completed in the northeast quadrant, bids will be sought for milling and resurfacing of those streets. Complete paving in the northwest quadrant will not occur until the sidewalks in that area are completed in 2021. Borough Council has been reserving funds for several years in order to be able to afford to complete the necessary street resurfacing.

## SEWER PROJECT UPDATE

The borough-wide sewer project is finally completed. Some of the yards were reseeded late in 2019 and will likely require some additional work in the spring. The contractor will return to make any final yard repairs.

All customers should have received by now their notice to complete their own sewer repairs. The rate of compliance thus far has been excellent.



## NATHAN'S DIVIDE NATURE CENTER PROJECT

Efforts are underway to open Nathan's Divide Nature Center — a center dedicated to outdoor recreation and environmental education. The center would be located alongside Ebensburg's upper reservoir, behind the Cambria County Transit Authority. The next step to making this center a reality is to coordinate a marketing and financial feasibility study, and a detailed comprehensive plan for the development of the project.



The results of the plan will answer important questions such as:

- How much will the project cost and where can we get the funds to build and maintain the project?
- Who will be the users? How far will they travel to visit?
- What indoor programs and displays will enhance the visitor experience?
- What outdoor recreation is most valuable to the visitors and the communities served?
- How large is the visitor center, and can it be used all year?

Organizers are seeking volunteers who may be interested in serving on the board of directors for Nathan's Divide and are looking for ideas for raising start up funding.

Donations will be used to pay for a Comprehensive Plan which would include a Feasibility Study for the nature center buildings and displays, and the Master Trail Plan with a link to the Ghost Town Trail Extension. The initial donation goal is raising \$45,000 to pay for the Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan will provide the information on initial construction costs and estimates on lifetime costs and benefits of the project.

### **Sign-Up for Automatic Water/ Sewer Bill Payment via ACH**



If you find yourself rushing around at the end of the month trying to get your bills paid, consider signing up to have the funds automatically withdrawn from your bank account on the last day your payment is due.

Next time you're in the office, just ask for the ACH application form to fill out to have your water/ sewer bill auto-deducted from your bank account. Don't forget to bring your checkbook as you'll need to provide your bank account and routing number. You can also find the form on the borough website in the "Quick Links" box under Online Applications.

## **Ebensburg Borough Ordinance requires that property owners clear sidewalks after the end of a snowfall within 12 hours.**

- Shovel the sidewalks full width to the bare pavement.
- Sprinkle a little sand to help prevent slipping on frosty sidewalks.
- DO NOT shovel snow into streets and alleys.
- Clear curb cuts at corners and crosswalks.
- Arrange for someone to shovel if you are unable or on vacation.

Are there neighbors on your street who are elderly, have a disability or may have a hard time shoveling for any reason? Work with your neighbors to give a hand and ensure your entire block is safe and accessible to all.

## **ONGOING SEWER SYSTEM MONITORING**

The purpose of the recently completed sewer project was the elimination of Inflow and Infiltration (I&I), or stormwater and/or ground water runoff, that was entering the system and causing overflows of sewage directly into Howell's Run.

It is critically important that we continue to monitor our sewage collection system in order to assure ongoing compliance. Certificates of compliance issued during the sewer project are good for a five-year period. After that, properties must again be pressure tested prior to any property transfer.

Staff will continue to monitor flows in the sewage system and make spot inspections of viewports. Any efforts made to illegally allow stormwater into the sewer system will be detected and are punishable with fines. Such efforts might include drilling holes in view port caps in order to drain low lying areas, removing or loosening a viewport cap, connecting a downspout to a sewer line, or connecting a sump pump to a sewer line.



## **PEOPLES NATURAL GAS PROJECT**

Peoples Gas has completed the installation of new gas lines in areas south of High Street. Work will continue in the northeast quadrant of town, and they will then continue into the northwest quadrant through 2020.

## **SIDEWALK AND CURB PROJECTS**

As soon as Peoples Gas completes their gas line replacement work in the northeast quadrant of town, bids will be awarded for new sidewalks and curbs on East Horner, East Crawford, East Sample and North Carolina Streets.
