EBENSBURG BOROUGH CERTIFIED AS GOLD LEVEL SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY

Ebensburg Borough is among a select group of high performing municipalities to become certified through the Sustainable Pennsylvania Community Certification program. Ebensburg Borough is recognized at the Gold level of certification for meeting

the program's rigorous performance criteria which track 131 policies and practices that define a sustainable community.

The Sustainable Pennsylvania Community Certification, managed by the Pennsylvania Municipal League in partnership with Sustainable Pittsburgh, is designed for municipalities that are working to save money, conserve resources, and serve vibrant communities. The certification is implemented statewide, recognizing boroughs, municipalities, cities, and home rule municipalities across the Commonwealth. The Pennsylvania Municipal League and Sustainable Pittsburgh applaud municipalities for their demonstrated commitment and sustainability performance.

In earning the Gold certification, Ebensburg Borough is acknowledged for its progress in such areas as community design and land use, energy efficiency, health and wellness, intergovernmental cooperation, recycling and waste reduction, fiscal controls, and internal management and operations. EBENSBURG WELCOMES COOK AS NEW BOROUGH MANAGER

In March of this year, Ebensburg's Borough Manager, Dan Penatzer, retired after serving in this role for the past 24 years. Prior to Penatzer's retirement, Borough Council formed a search committee and evaluated a number of qualified candidates. With more than 25 years of municipal management experience and degrees in public administration and political science, Ms. Kelly Cook quickly emerged as the lead candidate. Council approved the hiring of Ms. Cook as Ebensburg Borough's new manager at their January meeting



and she joined the borough staff in late February. Cook previously served as the Township Manager for both Tobyhanna Township, located in Poconos Pines, PA and Kingston Township, located in Luzerne County, PA. Most recently, she was employed as the City Administrator for 10 years with the City of Lower Burrell, PA. We hope you will join us in welcoming Ms. Kelly Cook to Ebensburg Borough!

EBENSBURG SKATE PARK PROJECT



A group of concerned citizens has recently formed an Ebensburg Skate Park Committee and is working to build a skate park in Ebensburg. The committee has researched the need for a park and has provided the following information:

We estimate that there are approximately 225 individuals in Ebensburg who are passionate about this sport (riding skateboards, trick bikes and trick scooters)

but don't have a place to do it safely. Many of these athletes are not drawn to team sports and therefore have been underserved, for many years, in our community. These athletes need a safe, sanctioned place to practice and develop their skills, not unlike those who play baseball, football, basketball, soccer, etc. Without a safe environment to practice their sport, this group uses what is available, which often includes sidewalks and streets. According to the U. S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, irregular surfaces and vehicular traffic are the two most common reasons for injuries related to skateboards, scooters or trick bikes. Skate parks draw skateboarders away from traffic and can be considered a valuable component of public safety.

The Skate Park Committee, with the support of the Ebensburg Borough and Recreation Committee, has identified a site by the Ebensburg Swimming Pool for the proposed 5,000 square foot skate park. A cost estimate to build a safe, concrete park of this size is approximately \$225,000. The financial goal is high yet the committee feels the safety of the citizens is priceless.



EBENSBURG'S HISTORIC KEYSTONE MARKER BACK ON DISPLAY

Ebensburg's historic Keystone Marker has been restored and placed back out on display. These iconic signs were produced in the 1920s by the Pennsylvania Department of Highways. Thousands were placed all across the state for many purposes, and several hundred remain today, most explaining the origins of the town names. Ebensburg's marker had been placed in storage after an accident had damaged it many years ago. It



was recently rediscovered and the Keystone Marker Trust was contacted for guidance on the restoration. Mr. Mike Wintermantel, of the Trust, was able to complete the restoration himself, which included a new collar on the back, a new finial on the top, replacement of missing letters and a new coat of paint. There are thought to have originally been two markers — one at each end of town. Borough staff is unaware of a second marker, but if anyone may know if

SAVE YOURSELF A TRIP TO THE OFFICE! - Sign-Up for Automatic Water/Sewer Bill Payment via ACH

If you find yourself rushing around at the end of the month trying to get your bills paid, consider signing up to have the funds automatically withdrawn from your bank account on the last day your payment is due.

Next time you're in the office, just ask for the ACH application form to fill out to have vour water/sewer bill auto-deducted from your bank account. Don't forget to bring your checkbook as you'll need to provide your bank account and routing number. You can also find the form on the borough website in the "Quick Links" box under Online Applications.

EBENSBURG'S ALLEY WAYS

The most common question asked of borough government by residents involves alleys. Several times each month there seems to be a property dispute concerning usage rights to an alley.

Across Ebensburg, alleys were included in a street plot many years ago but were never formally ordained or opened by the borough. The borough has long since lost any right to now open the alley or ordain it as a street. These non-ordained alleys were commonly used to haul coal into and ashes out of a residence. Some provide access to a garage that may have been constructed at the rear of the property. Some of the streets are cinderbased and utilized by traffic, and others remain grass and are never traveled. If the public has previously been permitted to utilize the alley, they cannot now be deprived of that right of use.

If the alley constitutes the sole access to a particular parcel of property, that parcel cannot now be denied that access.

No property owner is permitted to construct anything on the alley, as that would violate zoning setbacks. No property owner is permitted to store any materials on the alley, or to park a vehicle on the alley, as the property is not his/hers. Property owners abutting an alley are responsible for its maintenance, just as they are a sidewalk in front of their property.

There have been occasions in the past in which ALL property owners contiguous to the alley have agreed to petition to have the alley abandoned. Generally speaking, the borough does not object to such a joint effort. The borough has no ownership interest in the alley, and would in most cases support such a joint petition by waiving any interest it has or may have. An exception would be a case in which a borough-owned water or sewer line is located in the alley. The petition is actually filed with the courts, and if successful, the alley is divided between the contiguous properties.

In short, the borough does not own the alleys and does not provide long-term or winter maintenance to any of them. The adjacent property owners do not own them either, but nonetheless, are responsible for maintaining them. The adjacent owners all have access rights to the alleys.

REMINDER - GARAGE SALE & OTHER SIGNS

Posting signs for garage sales, lost & found or any other purpose on telephone poles or sign or light posts is PROHIBITED. Get a permit before holding any type of yard sale. They're **FREE**! The permit explains the rules regarding what type and number of signs are permitted. Signs attached to utility or street poles are removed by borough staff as soon as they are noticed. Be sure to follow these guidelines so you don't waste your time and money.

OUTDOOR BURNING RESTRICTIONS

Outdoor burning is ONLY permitted in the Borough on **Tuesdays between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm** and on **Saturdays between 8:00 am and 12:00 pm**. Burning must be done in metal receptacles, stoves or fire places constructed for that purpose.

TAX COLLECTOR CORNER

Keep in mind that school real estate tax bills were mailed on July 1st. If you did not receive your tax bill, please contact the tax collector at 814-846-4764. If you are paying at discount, the bills MUST be post-marked by August 31, 2021. Please note, the school no longer has a per capita tax.



Summer Clinics at the Ebensburg Tennis Center

Pee-Wee Beginner Clinic- This clinic is for children ages 5 thru 9 that have little tennis experience. Children will focus on scoring, court layouts and etiquette.
