Ebensburg Enjoys a Successful 2025

Council and staff were able to complete many projects during 2025:

- Celebrated the Borough's 200th Anniversary of incorporation.
- Opened 1975 Time Capsule and buried a new time capsule to be opened in 2075.
- Installed a new report management system in the police department that will automatically report data to the PA State Police and the FBI monthly.
- Installed two Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFPs) to improve pedestrian crosswalk safety at the intersection of W. High & Julian Streets.
- Conducted a Community Outreach Survey for borough residents.
- Completed a street resurfacing project in select areas.
- Continued inspection of water lines and laterals to comply with federally mandated Lead-Copper Rule.
- Installed thermal barrier at YPCC to prevent condensation from forming on courts.
- Replaced bollard lighting in Penn Eben Park.
- Partnered with CCHS students to implement "Brighten the Burg" Clean-Up Day.
- Worked with PA Tourism Signing Trust to get "Historic Downtown Ebensburg" and "Ghost Town Trailhead" signs installed along 22 and exits.
- Awarded a matching \$25,000 endowment fund from Community Foundation for the Alleghenies.
- Secured a \$4.093 million dollar grant for the dredging of Lake Rowena with various upgrades to the surrounding park.
- Completed hiring search for new Public Works Director and crew member.
- Purchased a new hook truck and leaf vacuum.
- Initiated a parking study to identify appropriate fee and enforcement strategies.
- Administered matching funds for five completed façade projects.

MEET EBENSBURG'S NEW PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR

Jerry Poruban was hired as Ebensburg Borough's Public Works Director in October after serving as the interim director since August. Jerry first joined the borough as a laborer with the Public Works department in September of 2021.

EBENSBURG INSTALLS TWO RECTANGULAR RAPID FLASHING BEACONS (RRFBs)

Two RRFBs have been installed on each side of W. High Street at the Julian Street intersection. **PA law requires drivers to yield to pedestrians in crosswalks.**

Pedestrians also have a responsibility not to enter traffic suddenly when vehicles cannot safely stop. Crosswalks are shared safety zones. Right-of-way is a legal obligation, not a courtesy—and it depends on awareness from all involved. Those who do not obey the laws of the crosswalk will be subject to a fine.

The YPCC – The primary mission of the Young Peoples Community Center (YPCC) has always been to provide activities and a safe, inviting place for the areas youth to play and hangout with their friends. While still keeping this at the core of the mission, the YPCC has evolved into a Health & Wellness Center as mentioned above. Adding various exercise classes into the daily activities at the YPCC. There is open gym daily (hours vary) at no cost for kids under 18 to play in the gym.

Cross-Country Ski & Bike/E-Bike Rental Programs — Both cross-country skis/equipment and bike rentals are now offered through the YPCC at an hourly rate of \$8/adult or \$6/youth; or full day rate of \$32/adult or \$24/youth. A waiver of liability must be signed before renting. E-Bikes rentals are offered at a rate of \$15/hour or \$60/day.

Pavilion Rentals – The Borough rents out three pavilions at Lake Rowena and two at the Ebensburg Borough Swimming Pool. The cost to rent a pavilion is \$125.00. Call the YPCC to check availability and to make a reservation.

Outdoor Skate/Hockey Rink – Located at Lake Rowena, the rink is open year round for street or in-line hockey. There are hockey goals provided and lights for evening play too. Best part is, it's FREE and open to the public. Removable pickleball nets are available for those who would like to play pickleball.

Swimming Pools – Since its renovation in 2011, the Borough Swimming Pool has been enjoyed by many. The area is fortunate to have a public pool that is up-to-date, heated, kid friendly and handicap accessible. The Borough Pool is available for after hour private party rentals.

Council Adopts 2026 Budget - Borough Council has adopted a \$7,670,745.00 budget for 2026. The general fund budget is balanced without an increase in real estate taxes. There are several projects planned in 2026, some of which will include:

1. Complete hiring process for a new borough manager.
2. Undertake dredging and improvements project at Lake Rowena.
3. Complete field restoration project at Memorial Field Complex.
4. Purchase and outfit the borough building with an emergency generator.
5. Introduce a borough-wide safety program for all employees.
6. Initiate fundraising campaign for the Ebensburg Endowment Fund.
7. Celebrate the nation's 250th anniversary with a 4th of July ceremony.
8. Participate in regional police study to be conducted by DCED to assess the potential for consolidation of services with neighboring municipalities.
9. Apply for a grant for the Jencks Dam area.
10. Seek out grants to continue with playground upgrades for Memorial Field Park.
11. Purchase new deck chairs, table umbrellas and non-skid surface mats.



TIPS FOR PEDESTRIANS FROM THE EBENSBURG BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Cross only at crosswalks. Don't cross between parked cars.
- Drivers are not required to yield until you begin to step into the crosswalk.
- Pedestrians should not walk or run unexpectedly into the path of a moving vehicle.
- Pedestrians should not assume drivers will see or yield. Look left, right then left again and keep looking.
- Wait for a gap in traffic, then step one foot off the curb or fully enter crosswalk and make eye contact with approaching drivers.
- Always obey traffic signs and signals especially pedestrian count down timers.
- See and be seen – drivers need to see you to avoid you. Wear bright clothing during the day and wear reflective materials or carry a flashlight at night.
- Watch for turning vehicles at intersections, even if you have the right-of-way and proceeding lawfully.
- Watch children. Children can't judge a vehicle's speed/distance and need the help of an adult to be safe.
- On streets with multiple lanes in each direction, be aware of what drivers in both near lanes are doing. If one driver is allowing you to cross, the other might not see you.
- If no sidewalk is available, walk as far on the side of the road as you can, and always walk against traffic.



TIPS FOR MOTORISTS FROM THE EBENSBURG BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Slow down when approaching a crosswalk or intersection. Watch for pedestrians and be prepared to yield to them.
- When a pedestrian crosses the street in a crosswalk, the driver must yield.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks – the law requires motorists to yield to pedestrians in crosswalks at signalized and non-signalized intersections.
- Travel at a prudent speed. Don't try to beat the light.
- Watch for mid-block crosswalks. Pedestrians have the right-of-way in mid-block crosswalks, so yield to them.
- Expect the unexpected – look out for children who may dart out between cars or buses or cross mid-block without a crosswalk.
- Drivers on streets with multiple lanes in each direction should be aware that pedestrians may be crossing all lanes.
- It is illegal for drivers to pass a vehicle that is stopped for a pedestrian in a crosswalk, as the second driver may not see the pedestrian in the crosswalk.
